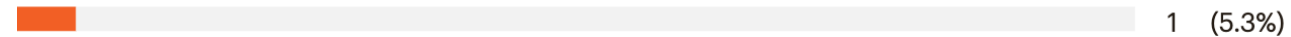

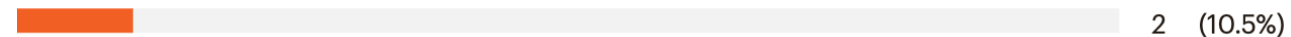

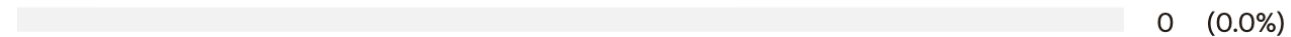

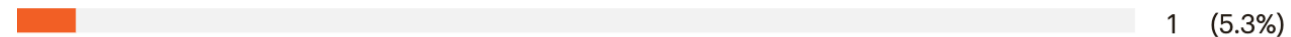

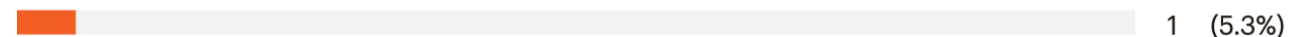

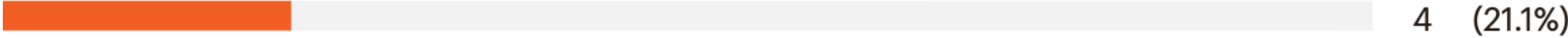

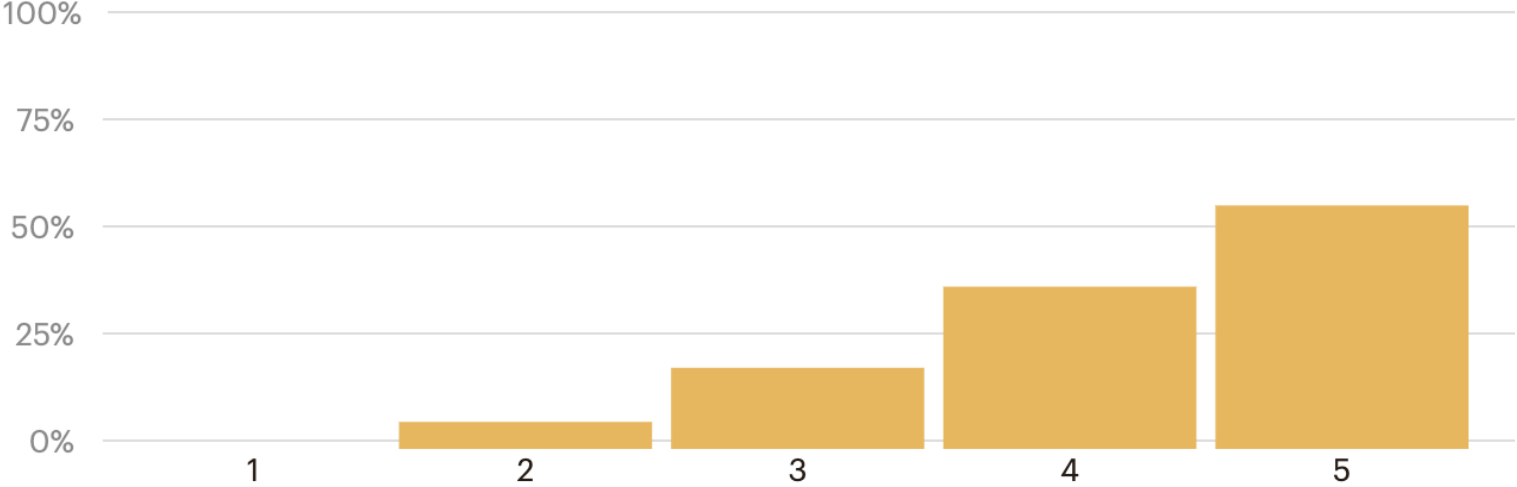

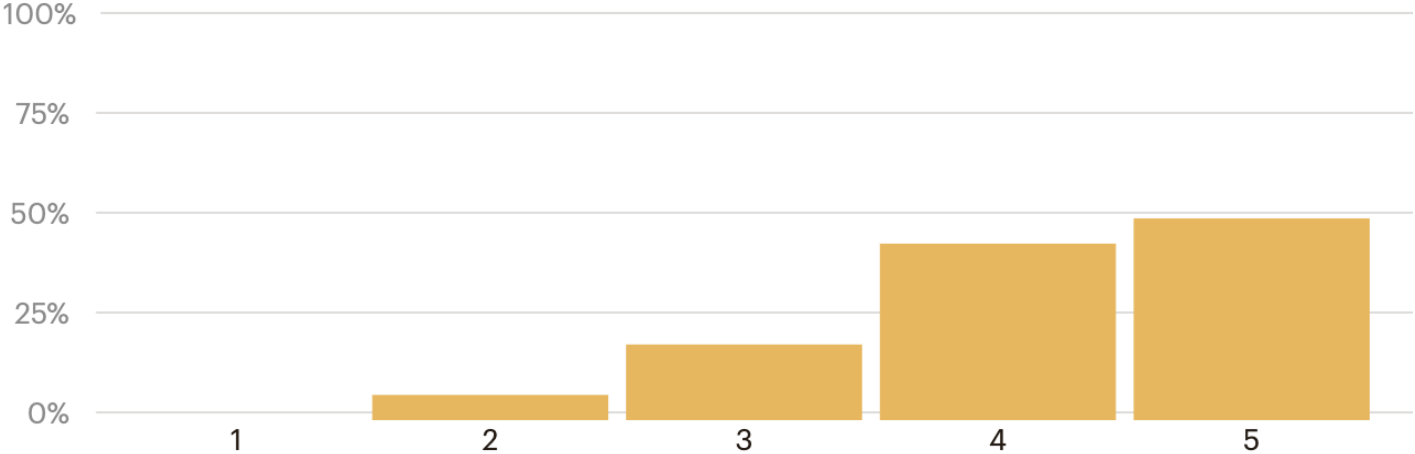
Question 4 has 19 answers (Range) Avg rating: 4.2

“3. Overall how satisfied were you with the Workshop?”



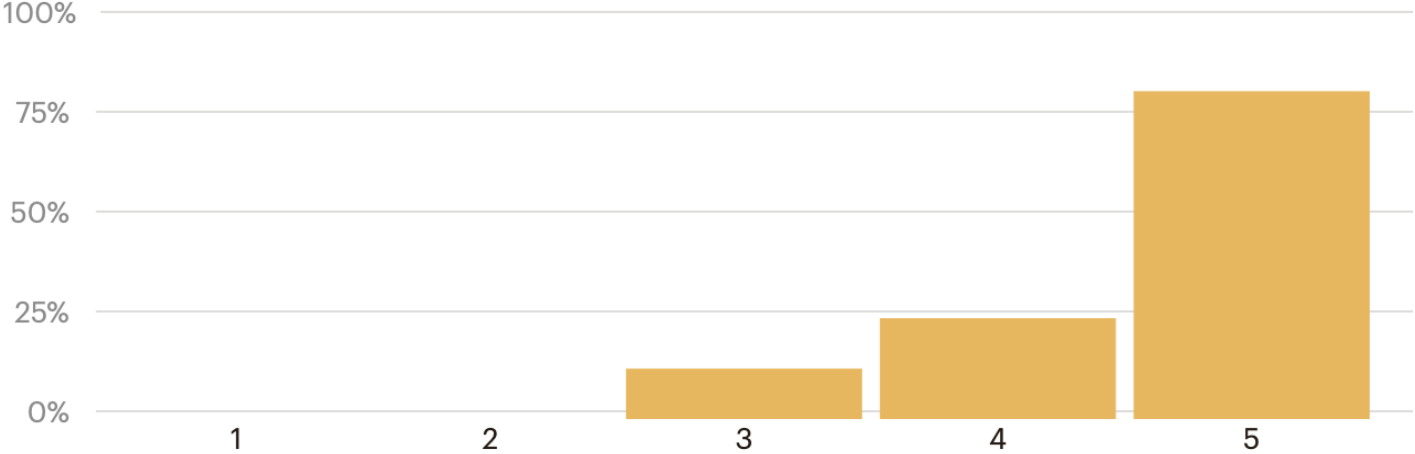
Question 5 has 19 answers (Range) Avg rating: 4.2

“4. How satisfied were you with the opportunities for networking and sharing ideas?”



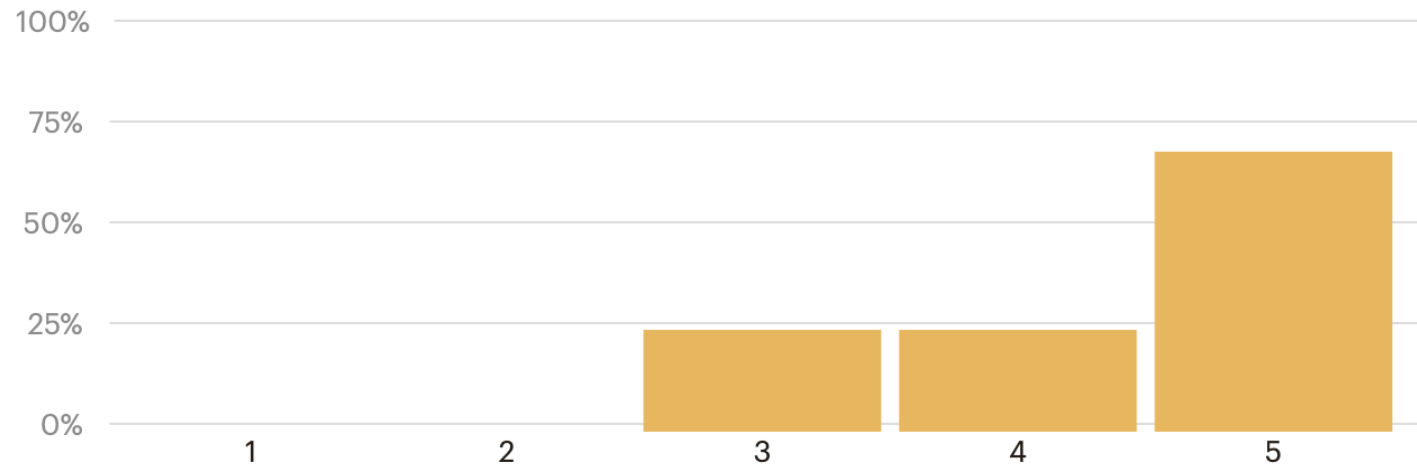

The presentation on the current status and challenges of implementation of monitoring acid deposition and air pollution was very informative, highlighting clear challenges which must be addressed in order to make progress on the issue. This is valuable to inform next steps of MoNRE - UNEP EANET cooperation.

One recommendation for future workshops would be to invite participants from other ministries. As addressing air pollution will require strong cooperation across sectors (e.g., agriculture, transport, energy, etc.), it would be good to have relevant ministries present to also benefit from the discussions (e.g., MAF, MPI, MPWT, MEM, etc.). This would enable awareness raising across ministries and would help create connections around how to address this cross-sectoral issue once there is a common understanding of the challenges and possible solutions."
